SILENT MOVIE SCREENING WITH PIANIST RICHARD HUGHES

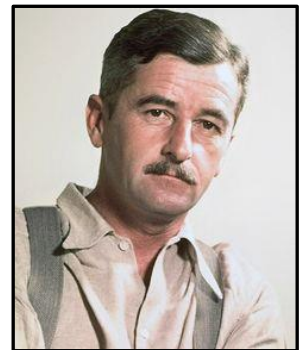
Tuesday, September 10, 6 p.m.

WILLIAM FAULKNER: HIS LIFE & WORKS

William Faulkner is one of the most celebrated writers in American Literature and winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1949. This program will focus on Faulkner's life and legacy, as well as his complex and controversial relationship with African Americans. Presenter Dr. Larry Lowenthal received an M.A. in English Literature from Northwestern and Ph.D. in Drama from NYU. More recently, he taught in the English and Jewish Studies Departments at Northeastern as an adjunct professor.
