ORDER NO. 2021-138-001 REQUEST OF THE FINANCE SUBCOMMITTEE

UPON THE REQUEST OF THE FINANCE SUBCOMMITTEE, THE CITY OF FRAMINGHAM, THROUGH THE FRAMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL, IT IS SO ORDERED:

That the City Council vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds or borrow the sum of \$25,232,452 to pay costs of the following General Fund FY-23 capital projects, as shown below:

and for the payment of costs incidental and related thereto, to be spent under the direction of the Mayor or his designee, with the exception of the School Department projects, which will be spent under the direction of the School Superintendent or his designee; that the Mayor is authorized to acquire by gift, purchase or eminent domain, permanent easements and temporary construction easements or other interests in land for said projects; that the Mayor is authorized to take all actions necessary or convenient to carry out the purposes of this order; and, further, to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer is authorized, with the approval of the Mayor, to issue from time to time bonds or notes in such amount pursuant to the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 44, or any other enabling authority. Any premium received by the City upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by this vote, less any such premium applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to the payment of costs approved by this vote in accordance with Chapter 44, Section 20 of the General Laws, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay such costs by a like amount.

And further, that \$609,000 is appropriated from Free Cash to fund the following projects: Climate Action Plan \$70,000, Fire Gear \$110,000, Parks Vehicle and Equipment Replacement \$150,000, Concrete Repairs Gas Tank at Police Headquarters \$79,000 and Catchment Investigations \$100,000

FURTHER ORDERED: that \$6,729,200 is appropriated to pay costs of the following Utility Enterprise Fund capital projects:
