PROCLAMATION

May 24, 2022

WHEREAS, the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, and Asexual + (LGBTQIA+) communities are an integral part of the vibrant culture and climate of Framingham; and

WHEREAS, Framingham embraces diversity in all forms including gender, race, age, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, religious beliefs and ability; and

WHEREAS, the month of June is designated National Pride Month honoring the history and achievements of the LGBTQIA+ community and commemorates the anniversary of the Stonewall Uprising which occurred in June of 1969, and is recognized as the start of the LGBTQIA+ rights movement; and

WHEREAS, Framingham is proud to be home to several outstanding LGBTQIA+ support organizations including **OUT MetroWest**, which for 11 years has been providing positive role models, challenging all systems of oppressions, and creating supportive spaces to respect, embrace, and celebrate LGBTQ+ youth; **Framingham GLASS**, who create a supportive community for LGBTQ+ youth of color and their allies through community space, groups, and services; and as a regional location served by **Greater Boston PFLAG** by hosting a Framingham support group for those with LGBTQ+ loved ones; and


