Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. was born in Crumrod, Arkansas, on March 2, 1942;

Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. was beloved brother of Narvous Stamps, Jr., Marcellus Stamps, and Hazel C. Stamps;

Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. was a veteran of the United States Army Infantry, having served his country in Vietnam as a Corporal Second Class;

Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. was formerly married to Allene A. (Harris) Stamps and they were the parents of Robin L. (Stamps) (Wilkins) Jones, Eurie A. Stamps, Jr., and Marlon D. Stamps, and he was also the father of Priscilla Mansfield McDowell, and Kyon E. Murrell, and the devoted stepfather to Calvin Lee Smith and Joseph Bushfan.

Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. was a devoted grandfather of 15 grandchildren and a loving great-grandfather;

Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. would help disconnected youth find a means to attend summer camps, find employment and seek mentoring guidance, willing to give an unknown kid his last dollar if it would help improve the situation;

Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. was an active leader of the Cambridge Youth Summer Basketball League for decades - for the entire time he lived there, and continued traveling back and forth between Framingham and Cambridge many times each week for board meetings and games, and had become a mentor to any student athlete who was lucky enough to be touched by him;

Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. was a retired Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority maintenance worker;

Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. lived in the Coburnville neighborhood of Framingham at 26 Fountain Street with his beloved wife Norma Bushfan Stamps;


Whereas, Eurie A. Stamps, Sr. was tragically shot and killed in Framingham on January 5, 2011;


Now Therefore, the Mayor, Council and School Committee in joint session declare Tuesday, March 2, as




in Framingham, and we urge all residents to take cognizance of this event and participate fittingly in its observance.
