ORDER NO. 2025-013 REQUEST OF THE FRAMINGHAM PUBLIC SCHOOLS

UPON THE REQUEST OF THE FRAMINGHAM PUBLIC SCHOOLS, THE CITY OF FRAMINGHAM, THROUGH THE FRAMINGHAM CITY COUNCIL, IT IS SO ORDERED:

That the Council votes to approve the Framingham Public School Department's submission of an application to the Massachusetts School Building Authority (MSBA) Accelerated Repair Program for Brophy and Potter Road Roof Projects, as follows:

Brophy Elementary School SOI Vote

Having convened in an open meeting on March 18, 2025, prior to the SOI submission closing date, the City Council of Framingham, in accordance with its charter, by-laws, and ordinances, has voted to authorize the Superintendent to submit to the Massachusetts School Building Authority the Statement of Interest Form dated March 21, 2025 for the Brophy Elementary School located at 575 Pleasant St, Framingham, MA 01701 which describes and explains the following deficiencies and the priority category(s) for which an application may be submitted to the Massachusetts School Building Authority in the future: MSBA's Statutory Priority #5: Replacement, renovation or modernization of school facility systems, such as roofs, windows, boilers, heating and ventilation systems, to increase energy conservation and decrease energy related costs in a school facility. The Brophy School roof was replaced in 2002, using a built-up roofing system with a life expectancy and associated warranty of twenty-years. The current roof is showing significant signs of age and degradation, requiring regular repair efforts annually; and hereby further specifically acknowledges that by submitting this Statement of Interest Form, the Massachusetts School Building Authority in no way guarantees the acceptance or the approval of an application, the awarding of a grant or any other funding commitment from the Massachusetts School Building Authority, or commits the City of Framingham to filing an application for funding with the Massachusetts School Building Authority.
